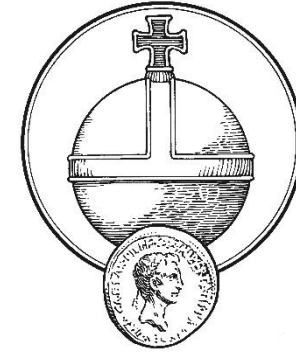
Bookmarks can be found on the resource table that include dates of both testaments, reminders of how to distinguish between law and gospel, and more.
