

The Service or The Communion. German: HauptGottsdienst (Chief Service). Swedish: Högmässa (High Mass. Norwegian and Danish: Höimesse (High Mass). The term Mass is authorized by the Augsburg Confession (Art. XXIV).

Certainly. It should always be used when only one service is held on a Sunday; and also whenever the Communion is administered.
